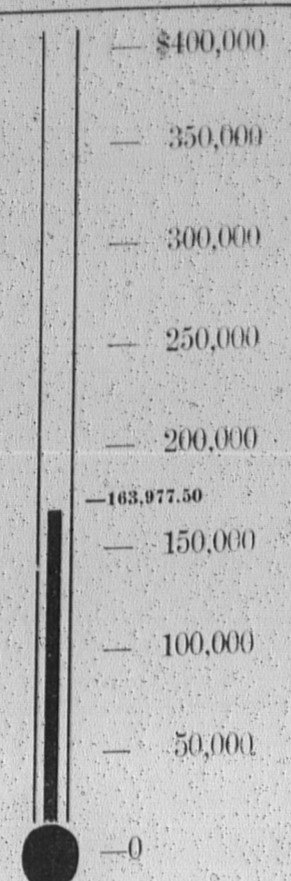
## Farber Graduates At Chicago

CHICAGO (Special) — Dr. Jack Russell Farber, Payette, Idaho, was one of the 491 graduates to receive degrees in the tenth wartime convocation of the University of Chicago in ceremonies held Friday, June 16, in Rockefeller Memorial chapel.

The 217th convocation, unique this year for the greatest number of bachelors' degrees granted to students in the College of the University under the Chicago Plan — college students at 15, college graduates at 18—was held at 3 p. m. with President Robert M. Hutchins the principal speaker. One hundred and twenty students, with the average age 19 and 11 of them only 17 years old, were granted their A. B. degrees. Two hundred and forty-seven received the conventional bachelor's degree, 73 master's, and 28 doctor of philosophy degrees.

Mr. Farber received a doctor of medicine degree from the University of Chicago. He received his S. B. degree from the University of Idaho in 1940.

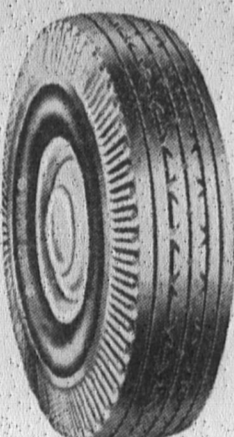
