## PAYETTE SCHOOLS SHOW DECREASE IN ENROLLMENT IN THREE YEARS

Serious Situation Confronts Community With Youth Not Attending School

Streamlining the procedure at the Payette high school this year will no doubt attract a much larger enrollment when students realize that they will be in a position to take vocational courses of their choosing for which they will receive up to two credits, was explained in a talk before the Payette Kiwanis club on Tuesday of this week by Superintendent W. C. Sorenson. Sorenson emphasized the fact that under a new arrangement students interested in taking up some work down town may spend one-half day at this work and at the end of the year, providing their work under proper instruction, has been satisfactory they will receive credits the same as though they had spent the entire time in classrooms.
