and Mrs. Oscar B. Stauff, Sr., of Payette, Idaho, is serving here with one of the B-17 Flying Fortress groups that are participating in the Eighth Air Force's daylight bombing offensive against the Nazi war machine.

As lead navigator in one of the squadrons of the 457th Bomb group, Lt. Stauff has taken part in some of the greatest bombing assaults ever carried out against Nazi Germany, including daylight attacks on vitally important targets at Munich, Hamburg and Leipzig. On D-Day his squadron led the entire group in an attack on enemy gun emplacements along the channel coast, and recently he chartered the course for the group when it went to Kassel and Cologne to pound industrial and key rail targets just behind the Siegfried Line.

During his combat career, Lt. Stauff has been decorated with the Air Medal and Oak Leaf Cluster for 'meritorious achievement.'

A graduate of Payette high school, where he was a member of the varsity football team, Stauff was a student at the University of Idaho when he entered the service.

New Ceiling Price Lists For Retailers

Supplemental ceiling price lists that will include all the changes that have been made in the prices of dry goods since issuance of the current quarterly community ceiling price lists will soon be forwarded to food retailers in most areas, the Office of Price Administration announced. Objectives of the additional lists is to make it easier for retailers and consumers to keep track of changes in ceiling prices. Under this plan it will only be necessary for grocers to post two lists for dry groceries—the quarterly list and this supplement—instead of the larger number of separate postings previously required. Thus it will be easier for housewives to find the price of an item.

Potato Growers Get Higher Prices

Producers of early white potatoes will receive prices assuring

them of the same average return as a year ago and about 17 cents a hundred weight above the legal minimum price, it is announced by the Office of Price Administration. At the same time, however, consumers will find that the average cost of this early crop of potatoes will be the same as retail prices of last season. The action was needed to maintain production at a level sufficient to meet estimated demands.

Cpl. Hansen's Unit Commended By Col.

A 7TH AAF BASE IN THE GILBERTS (Delayed)—Corporal Keith Hansen of Route 1, Payette, serving with the maintenance forces of a 7th AAF medium bomber group, has been commended, along with other members of his outfit, for outstanding performance of duty.

He is a veteran of four major 7th AAF blows against the Japs, having participated with his group in the Gilberts, Marshalls, Caro-

lines and Marianas campaigns. The commendation was issued by Colonel Murray A. Bywater, commanding officer of the group.

"I have infinite praise for, and pride in, those of our men who make up our ground crews for maintaining our airplanes," Colonel Bywater said. "We owe them much more credit than they usually get, and in many cases we owe them our lives."

"They have kept our 7th AAF B-25 Mitchell bombers flying over

thousands of miles of the vast Pacific Ocean and only those who have flown over the Pacific can realize just how vast it really is.

"The ground crews and maintenance men have done their jobs well, and have won the respect of all those who have had the opportunity of working with them."

Corporal Hansen entered the armed forces March 17, 1942, and has been serving with the 7th AAF in the Central Pacific as an airplane mechanic since October 20,

1943. His wife, the former Hermie Eida Toothman, resides at the Payette address.

The citation reads in part: "Floyd B. Wiseman, Sergeant (then corporal) medical corps has distinguished himself by meritorious achievement and service during the period from May 25 to Sept. 1, 1944. Sgt. Wiseman has aided tremendously in maintaining the health and efficiency of the headquarter detachment of the 99th bombardment group and directly aiding medical sections of the squadron when additional medical services were needed to care for the sick and wounded."

"Realizing that to maintain the health of the command at the highest level of efficiency is to insure maximum combat operating efficiency of the group, Sgt. Wiseman has considered each ailing officer and enlisted man of his personal medical charge and has accordingly volunteered to care for them without the necessity of being directed to do so."

Young Wiseman graduated from the Payette high school with the class of 1937 and has been overseas for 32 months.

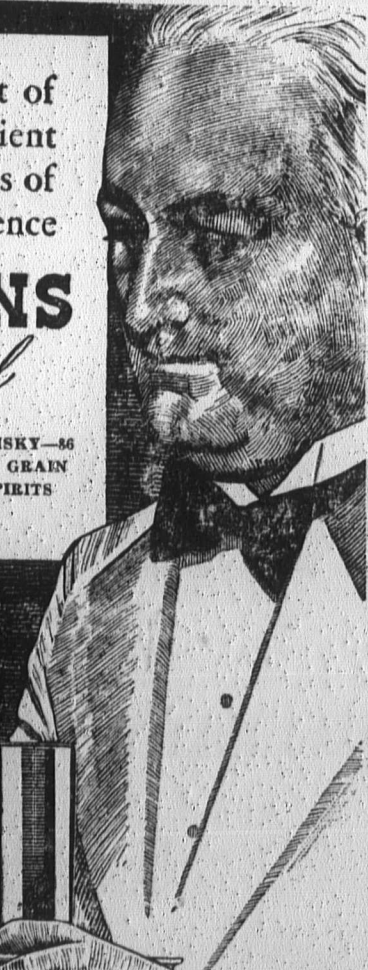
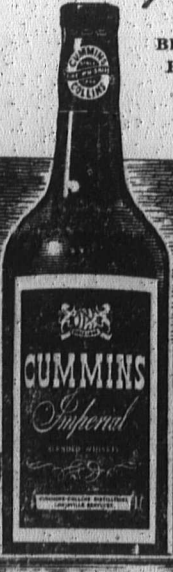
