Mrs. Rowena Keele has receiv ed the word that her son, Floyd B. Wiseman of the Medical corps attached to an aerial squadron, has received the bronze star. meritorious achievement in the Italian theater of war.

The citation reads in part: "Floyd B. Wiseman, Sergeant (then corporal) medical corps has distinguished himself by meritorious achievement and service during the period from May 25 to Sept. 1, 1944, Sgt. Wiseman has aided tremendously in maintaining the health and efficiency of the headquarter detachment of the 99th bombardment group and directly aiding medical sections of the squadron when additional medical services were needed to care for the sick and wounded.

"Realizing that to maintain the health of the command at the highest level of efficiency is to insure maximum combat operating efficiency of the group. Sgt. Wiseman has considered each ailing officer and enlisted man of his personal medical charge and has accordingly volunteered to care for them without the necessity of being directed to do so."

Young Wiseman graduated from the Payette high school with the class of 1937 and has been overseas for 32 months.
