Former Resident Dies In Portland

Cyrus Williams, one of the pioneer residents of Payette county passed away on December 6th at Portland, Oregon, according to word received by local friends. Mr. Williams was well known in Payette and he was one of the early members of Payette Lodge No. 22, I. O. O. F., having affiliated with that organization on Feb. 11, 1899. With his family he left Payette about fifteen years ago.

The following is taken from a recent issue of a Portland newspaper concerning his death:

Services for Cyrus Williams, Oregon pioneer, who died on Wednesday, were held today at Union, with the Rev. Mr. Fortune of the Methodist church officiating.

Williams, who was a stockman for many years, came from Iowa to Warner valley, Oregon, in 1882. He was said to be the last survivor of the group which first shipped cattle from Oregon via the Union Pacific railroad. He was notable for taking a graveyard shift job at Kaiser's Vancouver yard at the age of 86.

He is survived by a son, Henry K. of Firth, Idaho; daughters, Mattie B. Gilmore, of Sacramento, Cal.; Carrie C. Taylor, Ithaca, N. Y.; and Mrs. Mary E. Butzen, 3729 NE Albert court, Portland; 17 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.

Before the death of his wife, Laura, two years ago, the couple had observed the 63rd anniversary of their wedding December 21, 1881.
