How to do with eggs

In times like these it's a wonderful thing to know a lot about eggs—for, properly prepared, eggs are the basis for a wide variety of delicious dishes.

DO YOU KNOW?
Egg Equivalents
In most recipes calling for eggs, medium-size eggs are used as the basis for measurement.

4 to 6 whole eggs equal 1 cup
8 to 10 egg whites equal 1 cup
10 to 14 egg yolks equal 1 cup

To prevent yolk of hard cooked eggs from darkening: Remove from heat and plunge immediately into cold water.

Eggs should not be washed before storage because water removes the protective coating on the shell essential to keeping quality of eggs.

Egg yolks store well when covered with cold water, milk or salad oil; covered tightly and stored in refrigerator.

Egg whites store well when covered tightly and stored in refrigerator.

For best volume eggs should be at room temperature before beating.

Eggs should always be cooked at low temperatures as high temperatures toughen the protein.

BOILED OR SOFT CUSTARD
(A way with egg yolks)
A delicate, smooth sauce
4 egg yolks 2 cups milk
1/4 cup sugar 1 tsp. vanilla
1/2 tsp. salt extract

Beat egg yolks slightly with spoon in top of double boiler; add sugar and salt; mix well; add milk; and cook over rapidly boiling water about 10 to 15 minutes, or until mixture is slightly thickened and coats spoon, stirring occasionally. Remove from stove at once; add flavoring; and pour into cool bowl. Chill before serving. Makes 2 1/4 cups custard.
