

PASSENGER TIRES SHARPLY REDUCED

Only 1,600,000 passenger tires for cars and motorcycles will be available to civilians during April, as compared with the 1,600,000 available in March, OPA announced.

NEW RULING ON SEED POTATOES ANNOUNCED

Because of changes in the definitions of certified seed potatoes and "war approved" seed potatoes, such potatoes sold for table use must be sold as "table-stock" potatoes, at or below the ceiling prices established for table stock potatoes OPA said.

It has never been intended, OPA said that seed potatoes sold for table use should be sold at seed potato ceiling prices at any level of distribution. This action, which became effective March 24, 1945, is necessary because information received by OPA indicates that farmer-producers and carlot distributors of potatoes have been selling certified and "war approved" seed potatoes for table use at seed potato ceiling prices that are higher than the ceiling prices for table stock potatoes.
