

PROCEEDINGS
Of the Board of County Commissioners of Payette County, Idaho.

March 8, 1944

The Board of County Commissioners meets after recess at Payette, Idaho, on March 8, 1944. All members present.

It is hereby ordered that Payette County be and hereby is de-

clared as a Noxious Weed Control District. The following weeds are considered to be and are named as noxious weeds: Marsh-mallow, White-top, Russian Thistle, Canadian Thistle, Bumelia, Wood, perennial Ground Cherry, Leafy Spurge, Marihuana, Quack Grass, Bermuda Grass, Poison Oak, Knot weed, Fan Weed, Corn, Cow Cocks, Cow Cockle, and Crow's Foot, Morning Glory, White Top, Russian Thistle, Canadian Thistle, Pineapple Wood, Perennial Ground Cherry, Leafy Spurge, Marihuana, Quack Grass, Willows, Bermuda Grass, Poison Oak, Knot weed, Fan Weed, Corn, Cow Cocks, Cow Cockle, and Crow's Foot. All owners of property within the County of Payette, Idaho are hereby directed to destroy and exterminate all such weeds within the County of Payette, and to prevent such weeds from producing seeds within said area and all owners of property within such area are hereby directed and notified to destroy or control all such noxious weeds by cultivation or by other recognized procedure on or before June 1, 1944.

It is hereby ordered that the wages for the Field Deputy Assessor be fixed at 75 cents per hour until further order.

and Notice is hereby given that it may owners of land within said area fail or refuse to do so, the County Commissioners, at their regular session on March 8th, 1944, prescribed that the County Commissioners will then proceed at once to destroy all such noxious weeds that still remain growing in such areas and to collect the cost of such destruction as a charge against said lands at the same time and in the same manner as general taxes. Provided, however, that in case the owner, tenant or occupant of the land upon which such weed eradication is performed desires so to do, his share of such costs and expenditures may be paid immediately in cash.

It is hereby ordered that J. Arthur Johnson be and hereby is appointed to Road Supervisor as per section 33-408, for special County Road Districts.

It is ordered that Payette County contribute \$5.00 to provide funds for carrying the expense of control all such noxious weeds by cultivation or by other recognized procedure on or before June 1, 1944.

Mine From Surface

Mining of the Itabira ores of Brazil takes relatively little manpower because of the ease with which the iron can be taken out of the outcropping beds of ore. The miners simply remove an outer clay covering, drill holes for dynamite and then gather up the ore as it tumbles down in large chunks after the explosion. These chunks are then broken up in smaller sizes for shipment.
