

PROCEEDINGS

Of the Board of County Commissioners of Payette County, Idaho

March 2, 1944

The Board of County Commissioners of Payette County, Idaho, met after recessing February 21, 1944. All members present.

It is hereby ordered that Payette County be and hereby is designated

as a Noxious Weed Eradication District. The following weeds are considered to be noxious weeds: White Birch, Russian Knot, Canadian Thistle, Purple Loosestrife, Perennial Ground Cherry, Leafy Spurge, Marshmallows, Quack Grass, Willow, Bermuda Grass, Poison Oak, Knot Weed, Fan Weed, Corn Cockle, Cow Chick, and Crows Foot.

The following notice is hereby ordered printed in the official

newspaper. As per chapter 17, Title 22 I.C.A. as amended, Notice is hereby given that the Board of Commissioners, at their regular session on March 2, 1944, did create the County of Payette, State of Idaho, and all lands thereon as being noxious weeds, to-wit: Morning Glory, White Top, Russian Knot, Canadian Thistle, Purple Loosestrife, Perennial Ground Cherry, Leafy Spurge, Marshmallows, Quack Grass, Willow, Bermuda Grass, Poison Oak, Knot Weed, Fan Weed, Corn Cockle, Cow Chick, and Crows Foot. All owners of property within the County of Payette, Idaho are hereby directed to destroy and exterminate all such weeds within the County of Payette, and to prevent such weeds from producing seeds within said area and all owners of property within such area are hereby directed and notified to destroy, or control all such noxious weeds by cultivation or by chemical treatment or by other recognized procedure on or before June 1, 1944.

Notice is hereby given that if any owners of land within and upon said weeds on or before said date, and in the manner herein prescribed, that the County Commissioners will then proceed to destroy all such noxious weeds that still remain growing in such area and to collect the cost of such destruction as a charge against said lands at the same time and in the same manner as general taxes. Provided, however, that in case the owner, tenant or occupant of the land upon which such weed eradication is performed desires so to do, his share of such costs and expenditures may be paid immediately in cash.

It is hereby ordered that J. Arthur Johnson be and hereby is appointed to Road Supervisor for section 39-468, for special County Road Districts.

It is ordered that Payette county contribute \$5.00 to provide funds for carrying the expense of the Idaho Noxious Weed Control Association.

Insurance policy in Associated Indemnity Corporation on bodily injury and property damage liability on 1941 Chevrolet 1 1/2 ton truck is approved.

It is hereby ordered that the wages for the Field Deputy Assessor be fixed at 75 cents per hour until further order.

Whereas the following pieces or parcels of land have this day been offered for sale as per Sec. 30-768 I.C.A. as amended and whereas the bids made on the following described pieces and parcels of land no longer necessary for the use of this county, being such bids as this board may accept, it is ordered that such bids be accepted and the sale be and hereby is confirmed and the chairman and the clerk of this board are hereby authorized to issue deeds: The SE 1/4 NW 1/4, NE 1/4 SW 1/4, less tax 2, Sec. 2 T. 8 N. R. 5 W.B.M. Assessed in name of Payette County, care Frances Barclay, Care H. H. High and sold to Earl E. Kirk for \$250. An undivided one-half interest in SE 1/4 SE 1/4, Sec. 26, Twp. 3 N. R. 5 W.B.M. assessed in the name of Harry Jackson. Sold to C. H. Grant for \$60.00.

It is hereby ordered that a 10% discount be given for cash, both

pieces thereupon paying cash for said properties.

Whereas no acceptable bids were made on the following described property: (The name appearing immediately following the tract or parcel hereinafter described is the name of the taxpayer for tract or parcel as it appears in the assessment tax certificate upon which the tax deed, held by the county, covering such tract or parcel, was issued) and whereas said property is not necessary for the use of said Payette County, it is hereby ordered as per Sec. 30-713 that the following prices be fixed by this board as the minimum prices fixed for the following described pieces or parcels of land:

It is hereby ordered that as per section 30-708 I.C.A. as amended, the personal property described as one Adams leaning iron wheel grader No. 111 being no longer necessary for the use of the County, be sold to the highest bidder for cash on April 10th, 1944, at 10 o'clock A. M., Pacific War Time. The Board reserving the right to accept or reject all bids. The clerk is hereby authorized to notice same for sale.

Whereas on Dec. 24, 1935, the Recorder platted a portion of Sec. 35, T. 9 N. R. 5 W.B.M. and designated same as Shawna's First Sub-division of Payette Heights in which the following was designated as a roadway to-wit:

Beginning at a point 26 ft. East and 339.5 ft. South of the NW corner of Sec. 35, Twp. 9 N. R. 5 W. B. M.; thence East 2607 ft. thence North 618 ft. thence East 30 ft. thence South 1291 ft. thence West 30 ft. thence North 643 ft. thence West 2067 ft. thence North 30 ft. to the point of beginning; And Whereas said lands were designated within the boundaries of Highway District No. 2, Payette County, and should be turned over to, and be made a part of the highway system of said Highway District and said lands nor any part thereof are not now necessary for the use of Payette County and should be conveyed to said Highway District for road purposes. Now, therefore, it is ordered that said lands be conveyed to Highway District No. 2, and deed be executed.
