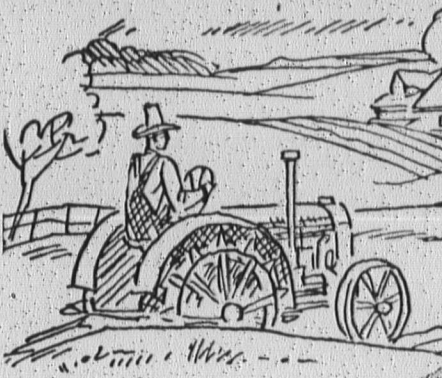

Tim Farmer has enlisted in the Navy, Mr. and Mrs. Farmer now have three sons in the Navy.

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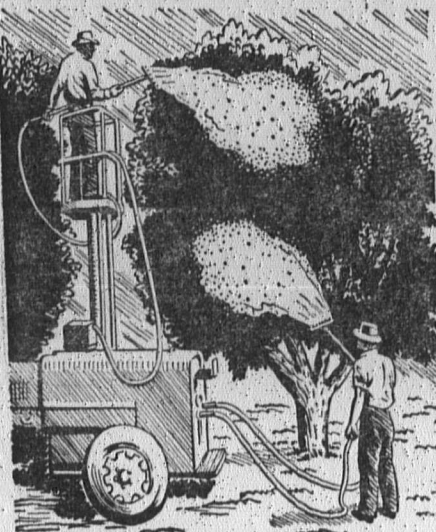
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
