Two Truck Models Authorized For Ford

The Ford Motor Company's 1944 truck production, authorized by WPB and ODT to meet essential civilian needs, will be in two models, Model 498-T-a Truck Chassis type has a 158-inch wheel base while Model 494-T, School-Bus Chassis has a 194-inch wheel base.

Both models are powered with the 100-horsepower V-8 engine.
