Left Too Long

Summer squash is frequently left on the plant too long. The squashes are best when six to eight inches long and while the rind is still smooth and soft. Cucumbers, regardless of their size, remain in good condition until they begin to lose their dark green color. Leave tomatoes on the plant until they are fully ripe. Vine-ripened tomatoes are sweeter and have a higher food value than fruits ripened in the kitchen on the window-sill.

Bauxite Source

Bauxite (aluminum ore) is taken in great quantity from the interior of British Guiana. The deposits are worked by U. S. companies, and the entire output comes to North America. The United States gets 93 per cent of its bauxite imports from British and Dutch Guiana (Surinam). Mineral riches of the colony include gold and diamonds.

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Low Casualty Rate

The 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 per cent death rate of army evacuation hospitals in the African campaign was the lowest of any army in history. Plasma, sulfa drugs and excellent surgery were credited with this medical victory which put the death rate more than 11 per cent below that of World War I.

Busy Depot

In a single day the workers at the Richmond, Calif., tank depot prepare more military materiel for overseas service than was possessed by the entire U. S. army before the war. Most of the tanks and armored vehicles used by our forces in the Pacific have come from this depot which prepares tanks, bomb trailers, tractors and other military vehicles and also builds jeeps.

Alaskan Fisheries Varied

Although the salmon fisheries of Alaska yield products comprising 90 per cent of the value of all fishery products of the territory, at least 12 other species of fish and shellfish are taken in commercial quantities.

Keep Cold
