

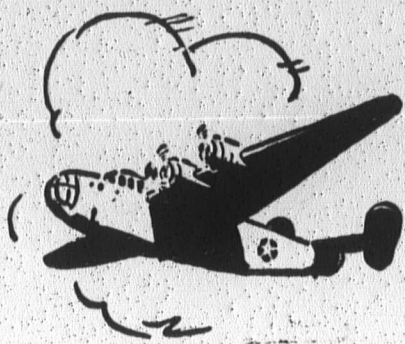
Armistice Day • 1944
