

\$2.09**How to do with eggs**

In times like these it's a wonderful thing to know a lot about eggs — for, properly prepared, eggs are the basis for a wide variety of delicious dishes.

**DO YOU KNOW?****Egg Equivalents**

In most recipes calling for eggs, medium-size eggs are used as the basis for measurement.

\* \* \*

4 to 6 whole eggs equal 1 cup  
8 to 10 egg whites equal 1 cup  
10 to 14 egg yolks equal 1 cup

To prevent yolk of hard cooked eggs from darkening: Remove from heat and plunge immediately into cold water.

\* \* \*

Eggs should not be washed before storage because water removes the protective coating on the shell essential to keeping quality of eggs.

\* \* \*

Egg yolks store well when covered with cold water, milk or salad oil; covered tightly and stored in refrigerator.

\* \* \*

Egg whites store well when covered tightly and stored in refrigerator.

\* \* \*

For best volume eggs should be at room temperature before beating.

\* \* \*

Eggs should always be cooked at low temperatures as high temperatures toughen the protein.

**BOILED OR SOFT CUSTARD**

(A way with egg yolks)

A delicate, smooth sauce

4 egg yolks 2 cups milk  
1/4 cup sugar 1 tsp. vanilla  
1/8 tsp. salt extract

Beat egg yolks slightly with spoon in top of double boiler; add sugar and salt; mix well; add milk; and cook over rapidly boiling water about 10 to 15 minutes, or until mixture is slightly thickened and coats spoon, stirring occasionally. Remove from stove, at once; add flavoring; and pour into cool bowl. Chill before serving. Makes 2 1/4 cups custard.
