Dr. Fred Zieger Veterinarian Dies

Dr. Fred Zieger, 65, who practiced as a veterinarian in this county for over thirty years, died in this city last Saturday following several years of failing health.

Funeral services with Lundson's in charge will be held Friday afternoon at 1:30 at the Church of God of which the deceased was a long time member. The Rev. Harold Jacks will give the sermon.

Dr. Zieger was born in Stark county, Ind., May 24, 1880. When he was nine, his parents moved to Harrison county, Mo., where they resided for some time. He and his family later resided in Nebraska, Kansas, and Harlan county, Nebr. At the latter place he engaged in farming until 1913 when he moved to this section of Idaho. During his over thirty years here he practiced his profession as a veterinarian until he had to give it up a few years ago on account of failing health.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mary Zieger of LaGrande, Ore., one son, Floyd Zieger, Sumner, Calif.; five daughters, Mrs. Myrtle Donahue, Spokane, Wash.; Mrs. Velma Snow, Los Angeles, Calif.; Mrs. Elsie Stevens, Pringle; Mrs. Beulah Williams, LaGrande; and Mrs. Adelaide Seales, Summerville, Calif.; one brother, George W. of Pringle; two sisters, Mrs. Hattie Burns, Princeton, Idaho; and Mrs. Ella Zentling, Marshfield, Mo.; eight grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. Two of his children preceded him in death.

Legion And Auxiliary Sponsor Campaign

Christmas gifts for everyone in all the hospitals where wounded and sick servicemen and veterans are under treatment is the goal of the "Gifts for Yanks Who Gave" program being launched this month by the American Legion and auxiliary throughout the country. Plans for the vast activity, expected to bring more than one million gifts to those forced to spend Christmas in the service and veterans hospitals, were completed by a joint legion and auxiliary committee.

Gift packages will be solicited from the public by Legion posts and auxiliary units throughout the country from October 1st to December 15th. The gifts will be distributed to hospitals in every part of the United States and overseas. The number is expected to be larger than last year, when 1,179,359 gift packages were distributed.

Locally the gifts are to be left at the stores where they will be inspected by an auxiliary committee and gift wrapped for mailing.
